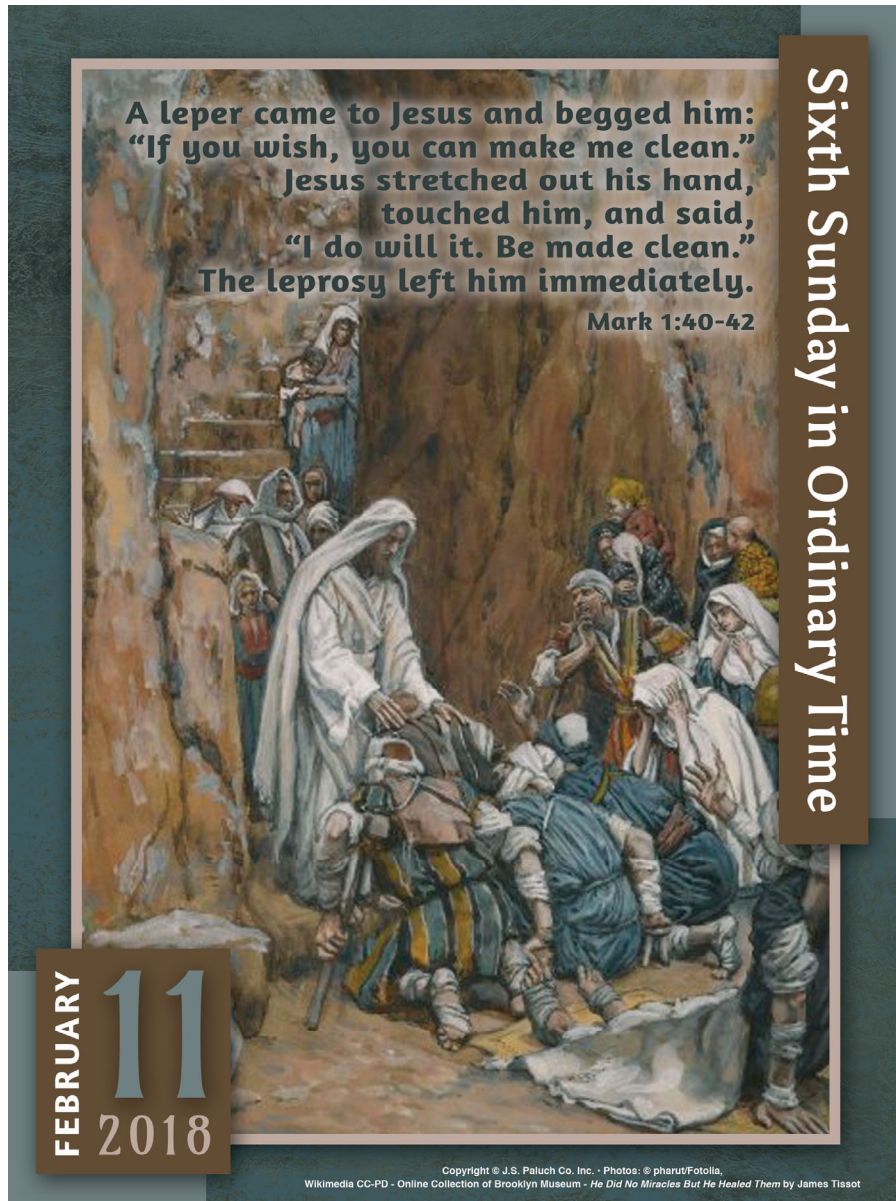

10 Amazing Facts about the Power of the Eucharist

(Will be continued in the following weekend bulletin)

We have a heavenly Father who knows our every need and goes to great lengths to give us what we require. Our daily bread is not a symbol or mere earthly sustenance; it is true spiritual food, the real flesh and blood of our Savior the God-man. The Eucharist is nourishment that transcends ceremony and finds its power and its essence in the very workings of the Trinity itself.

Here are some of the amazing effects of the Eucharist:

- 1) *Union with Christ:*** Reception of Jesus in the Eucharist fuses our being with that of Christ. St. Cyril of Alexandria describes it as similar to “when melted wax is fused with other wax.” The Christian journey is a journey to become like Christ, to “abide in him” and he in us. The Eucharist is the means for this to happen.
- 2) *Destruction of venial sin:*** The Eucharist destroys venial sin. Destroys! Through sin, the fervor of our charity can be dampened by venial sin. But when we receive the Eucharist we are united with Charity himself, which burns away the vestiges of our venial sins and leaves us cleansed and ready to begin again.
- 3) *Preservation from mortal sin:*** While we should refrain from receiving the Eucharist when we are aware of being in a state of mortal sin, we should receive the Eucharist as much as possible when we are able because it *preserves* us from grave sin. It is as if the Eucharist’s power washes away the venial sin in our souls and then covers us with a protective coat which helps us to stay away from serious sin.
- 4) *Personal relationship with Jesus:*** Many Christians speak of the importance of a personal relationship with Jesus, which is very true. But it is primarily through the Eucharist that we can truly have an intimate encounter with the Person of Jesus. Benedict XVI once pointed out this connection:

“Today, there is a need to rediscover that Jesus Christ is not just a private conviction or an abstract idea, but a real person, whose becoming part of human history is capable of renewing the life of every man and woman. Hence, the Eucharist, as the source and summit of the Church’s life and mission, must be translated into spirituality, into a life lived ‘according to the Spirit’” (*Sacramentum Caritatis*).
- 5) *Gives life:*** According to the Catechism, the Eucharist “preserves, increases, and renews the life of grace received at Baptism” (CCC 1392). In other words, reception of the Eucharist increases the life of grace already present within us. Sounds even better than a trip to a spa!

The Lenten season is here. Making daily Mass at least once on weekdays is the highest form of worship we can offer to the Almighty God. Let's prepare to have a powerful Lent. Don't forget all Fridays are abstinence from meat.

Sacramental Information & New Parishioners

Baptism: Expectant parents should contact the office four to six (4 - 6) months *before the birth of the child*.

Marriage: Couples planning marriage need to make an appointment with the pastor at least **six** months before the intended wedding date to begin the preparation process. A wedding date cannot be scheduled without approval of the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick: Contact the office to schedule an appointment, home or nursing home visit, and, if death is imminent, contact the office for immediate action.

First Communion and Confirmation: Contact the Elementary DRE or High School DRE respectively.

Holy Communion for the Homebound: Contact the parish office to request a visit.

If you are interested in becoming Catholic or receiving Confirmation as an adult, or if you simply want to learn more about your faith, contact the office to inquire about RCIA. "Jesus said to them, 'Come, and you will see'" (John 1:39).

New Parishioner Forms are found in church and on our website (Policies and Forms, Census Form) and should be submitted to the office.

What is a St. Joseph Altar?

Sts. Peter and Paul Church will erect its first St. Joseph Altar this year. The altar will be blessed after 4 p.m. mass on March 17th and remain open after each mass that weekend and on Monday, March 19th, the feast day of St. Joseph. The tradition of the making of an altar originated in Sicily during the Middle Ages. During a severe drought the people prayed to St. Joseph to end the famine, and the rains came. Farmers who were successful in the harvest set up altars in their homes. The family prepared the food and shared it with those in need. As people migrated to the United States, this tradition was brought with them.

Why are there St. Joseph altars in Louisiana?

A large migration of Sicilians occurred at the beginning of the 20th century. These people settled in the New Orleans area and brought their deep devotion to St. Joseph. During World War II St. Joseph altars flourished as mothers and wives petitioned for the safe return of their sons and husbands. Through the years what started out as simple altars in private homes has grown to large altars in churches, courtyards, and halls. This devotion to St. Joseph has spread throughout the state and adopted by all nationalities.

How can you participate?
