6) *Unity with the Body of Christ:* Since we are united more closely to Christ through the Eucharist, we are therefore united more closely to all the other people who receive the Eucharist! In other words, the Eucharist is like the glue that keeps us united with Jesus and all our brothers and sisters in the Church.

7) *Commits us to the poor:* The words of St. John Chrysostom shame those of us who leave the Eucharistic table without caring for Christ in the poor:

“You have tasted the Blood of the Lord, yet you do not recognize your brother,. . . .You dishonor this table when you do not judge worthy of sharing your food someone judged worthy to take part in this meal. . . . God freed you from all your sins and invited you here, but you have not become more merciful.”

8) *Spiritual consolation:* Holy Communion is a foretaste of the joys of heaven so it can produce joy in us as we experience real unity with God. If we are feeling beaten down by the difficulties of life, we can come to the Eucharist, our font of joy, and ask the Lord to fill us with his consolation and peace.

9) *Peacemaking:* In the Synod on the Eucharist in 2005, the bishops discussed how the reception of the Eucharist in war-torn areas transformed the people of God and gave them the impetus to seek peace:

“Thanks to eucharistic celebrations, peoples engaged in conflict have been able to gather around the word of God, hear his prophetic message of reconciliation through gratuitous forgiveness, and receive the grace of conversion which allows them to share in the same bread and cup.” (Propositio 49)

10) *Provides a focal point for our lives:* If we really understood the profound nature of the Eucharist, we would begin to center our lives around Holy Communion. There is nothing more important that can happen in our lives. Not football games, or get-togethers or picnics. There is nothing more important than our weekly appointment to receive the medicine of the Doctor of souls, Jesus.

All of these amazing effects and more can be yours this Sunday! Or better yet, try going to a daily Mass near you. But remember that your disposition when receiving the Eucharist can determine how open you are to the powerful effects. So, be reverent, focused and beg God to give you, through the power of the Eucharist, all the graces that you need in your life right now. Like a good Father, he will listen

Sacramental Information & New Parishioners

Baptism: Expectant parents should contact the office four to six (4 - 6) months *before the birth of the child*.

Marriage: Couples planning marriage need to make an appointment with the pastor at least **six** months before the intended wedding date to begin the preparation process. A wedding date cannot be scheduled without approval of the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick: Contact the office to schedule an appointment, home or nursing home visit, and, if death is imminent, contact the office for immediate action.

First Communion and Confirmation: Contact the Elementary DRE or High School DRE respectively.

Holy Communion for the Homebound: Contact the parish office to request a visit.

If you are interested in becoming Catholic or receiving Confirmation as an adult, or if you simply want to learn more about your faith, contact the office to inquire about RCIA. "Jesus said to them, 'Come, and you will see'" (John 1:39).

New Parishioner Forms are found in church and on our website (Policies and Forms, Census Form) and should be submitted to the office.

Parishioner Funeral: When a parishioner passes away we ask that you please contact the parish office first before going to the Funeral Home. Fr. Mark would like to set up an appointment with the family of the deceased.

What can you expect to see on the St. Joseph Altar?

The main section of the altar is three-tiered to represent the Trinity and holds the statue of St. Joseph. The colors of red, white and green represent the Italian flag. Everything on the altar is donated. All types of food can be placed on the altar except for meats since St. Joseph's feast day is during the Lenten season. There are many symbols represented on a St. Joseph altar. Breads are baked in shapes related to St. Joseph – hammer, saw, nails, ladders, staff, and sandals. Bread crumbs represent sawdust. Other shapes may relate to Christ – crown of thorns, a cross, the Monstrance. Fish and bread loafs represent the multiplication of the loaves. Wine recalls the wedding feast at Cana. Cakes decorated with religious symbols are also on the altar. Statues and flowers adorn the altar. Candles are donated in memory of a loved one or in thanksgiving for a favor received. There may also be hard-boiled eggs to symbolize the coming of Easter. As with the first altars, all donations on the altar are given to the needy.

Petitions - There will be a basket on the altar for you to place your petition as you make your prayer to St. Joseph.

Gift bag - There will be a gift bag for you to take home in remembrance of this celebration.

Why a bean?

A staple of every gift bag is the fava bean. This bean was the only crop that survived during the famine. It was grown as fodder for the animals but saved many people from starvation during the drought. This is why it is called the "lucky bean". The legend goes that if you have a fava bean in your pantry it will never go bare. This is strictly a legend.

How can you participate?

A parish meeting will be held February 20th at 6:30 p.m. at the Church Hall. The Catholic Daughters Court 2321 is hosting the altar but help from all parishioners is needed for a successful altar.
